
Deaf Awareness tips for the classroom



Always use subtitles for videos or provide a transcript.



Tell me about the Visual Language of Closed Captions and Subtitles



Keep background noise to a minimum: -shut windows and doors

-turn off noisy machines

-provide a quiet environment for group work

-turn-taking when speaking and reiterate comments

Make yourself as visible as possible when speaking:

-seat deaf students nearer the front

-don't move about when speaking

-have good lighting on your face

Use visual support:

- images
- diagrams
- video clips
- drawings
- key words

Give clear messages:

- -check understanding
- -don't give messages at packing up time

-make sure homework and messages are understood

-tell IR staff important messages



Provide written materials so students can watch and listen:

-printed notes and handouts-key vocabulary-jot down comments from class
